### A glimpse into the process behind



A lot of work and thought goes into lettering each and every comic book page. From the font selected to represent the dialogue, to the words bolded or italicized for emphasis, to the placement of word balloons from panel to panel so as not to obscure Giovanni Timpano's outstanding art.

Troy Peteri, the letterer of *Eclipse*, gives his thoughts:

As the letterer on the majority of Top Cow's titles for the last decade or so (Ouch, that time went quickly!), I don't often have the opportunity to talk about what it is that I do, because I'm too busy doing it. But here goes, there's a method to (most of) my madness.

Any time I start lettering a new series, I decide which fonts and styles will be used based on two things: art style and genre. Knowing that this was a futuristic series with sci-fi overtones, I chose the main fonts and styles because they reminded me of the ones a reader would see in the oversized European sci-fi hardcovers.



Since the title takes place in a kind of postapocalyptic society, all of the establishing captions should look weathered and dilapidated.



As for the main dialogue font throughout, I chose it with the same logic in mind. It should look organic and relatively "hand-drawn," like many European comics, rather than similar to what's seen in SO many typical monthly comics.



One of my favorite elements of Giovanni's artwork is that it reminds me of classic illustration and has a very cinematic feel, and I didn't want the lettering to be "loud" or overpowering. I'd worked on another book with his artwork recently, where I chose to letter everything with more esoteric word balloons and balloon tails due to the genre of the comic, and I didn't want to copy myself on this book.





So all of the dialogue, electronic balloons, etc. are very basic and staccato, because the vibe of the book itself (to me, humbly) is closer to that of *Alien* or a John Carpenter film rather than a loud *Independence Day*-like sci-fi movie. So, even the loud balloons aren't that loud, and the sound FX are as subtle as I can keep them.



My main job as a letterer is to guide the reader's eye through the artwork in the proper order so the readability is clear, and my second most important job is making sure important artwork isn't covered.



This spread is a good example of me trying to force the reader's eye in one direction, because the artwork is cinematic enough that it really doesn't NEED any dialogue to tell the story, so I wanted to make sure the reader sees everything in the proper order.

We hope that this look inside the lettering process on *Eclipse* (and all other comic books), has been informative and eye-opening!
